Pocketing the 9-Ball on the Break

If a player pockets the 9-Ball off of the break, and the cue ball is not scratched or a foul does not occur, it is considered a 10-0 win.

Pocketing the 9-Ball on the break while committing a foul (such as a scratch) results in ball in hand for your opponent. The 9-ball is spotted.

RO in 9-Ball

This is to ensure everyone knows the definition of an RO. A RO is a nine ball run out on a player's first turn at the table (a break is considered a turn at the table). All 9 balls must be on the table at the start of the shooter's turn at the table. There are really two chances for an ERO: 1) the player breaking breaks and runs the table or 2) the opponent runs the table after a dry break that resulted in all 9 balls remaining on the table.

Please note an ERO is a 10-0 in 9-ball.
